The name Woodcutter's stems from when David Powell spent several years working in the Scottish Highlands as a lumberjack or woodcutter in the Torbreck forest.

This is just a reflection of the up and coming younger Shiraz vineyards of the Barossa, rather than the battle hardened old warriors which make up the heart and soul of the of the established Torbreck range.

2004 WOODCUTTER'S SHIRAZ

VARIETAL: 100% Shiraz

REGIONS: Koonunga Hill, Ebenezer, Krondorf, Marananga and Greenock

HARVEST: Mid to late April 2004

pH: 3.65

TA: 6.35g/L

ALCOHOL: 14.5 % Alc/Vol

VINIFICATION: *Fruit is sourced from hand harvested and hand-tended, low yielding vines. It is open fermented, gently basket pressed and then aged for 12 months in large format 100 year old French oak foudres (vats).*
